As we look forward to welcoming students back for hybrid in-person instruction, we ask that you continue to monitor your child daily for symptoms and keep your child home if he or she is experiencing TWO OR MORE of the following symptoms: fever, chills, rigors (shivers), myalgia (muscle aches), headache, sore throat, nausea, diarrhea, fatigue, congestion or runny nose; OR AT LEAST ONE of the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new loss of smell, or new loss of taste.

In addition, the New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) released a [letter](#) from the Communicable Disease Service, outlining the recent modified recommendation for return to school for children with COVID-19 compatible symptoms. The NJDOH recommends that any child with COVID-19 compatible symptoms should not return to school until they have either received a negative viral test (molecular or antigen) for SARS-CoV-2 or they have completed the isolation period of at least 10 days since symptom onset and at least 24 hours after resolution of fever without fever-reducing medications with symptom improvement.

Lastly, according to the [NJ Travel Advisory](#), New Jersey strongly discourages all non-essential interstate travel at this time. Travelers and residents returning from **any U.S. state or territory** beyond the immediate region (New York, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, and Delaware) should self-quarantine at their home, hotel, or other temporary lodging following [recommendations from the CDC](#):

- If travel is unavoidable, travelers should consider getting tested with a viral test (not an antibody test) 1-3 days before the trip and again 3-5 days after the trip.
- If travelers test positive, they should **self-isolate for at least 10 days and should postpone travel during that time.**
- If travelers test negative, they should **quarantine for a full 7 days after travel.**
- If testing is not available (or if the results are delayed), travelers should **quarantine for 10 days after travel.**

Please continue to communicate with our school nurse and COVID-19 contact, Mrs. Cyndi Hess, to notify the school if your child has been exposed to COVID-19 or has recently traveled outside the state of New Jersey.
